# Year: 4 Term: Summer

### SCIENCE

### Sound

- Identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating.
- Recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear.
- Find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it.
- Find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it.
- Recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.
- Explore and identify the way sound is made through vibration in a range of different musical instruments from around the world.
- Find patterns in the sounds that are made by different objects such as saucepan lids of different sizes or elastic bands of different thicknesses.

Experiment- sound over distance with variables such as materials used/distance

### **MATHS**

- Round decimals (one decimal place) to the nearest whole number.
- Use partitioning to double or halve any number, including decimals to one decimal place
- Multiplying together three numbers
- Recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths
- Recognise and write decimal equivalents to 1/4, 1/2, <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>
- Solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places
- Estimate, compare and calculate different measures, including money in pounds and pence
- Recognise that one hundred 1p coins equal £1 and that each coin is 1/100 of £1
